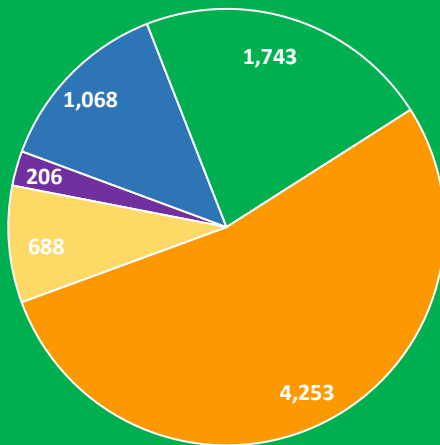

FEATURED PROGRAMMING



Living WITH the Northwoods, 6/15–8/20, highlighted an art exhibit, *Birch Bark Art of the Anishinaabeg*, and a community-build wigwam project. Wayne Valliere, NEA 2020 National Heritage Fellow and elder in the Lac du Flambeau band of the Lake Superior Ojibwe, led these efforts. This special programming featured **43 class/event offerings** resulting in **717 individual artistic experiences**. The exhibit alone brought in **over 1,200 visitors**.

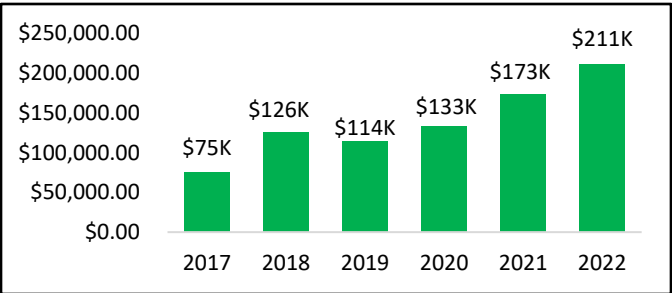

Eagle River’s Warehouse Community Arts Center is home to the largest variety of creative experiences in the Northwoods, created by artists, for the artist in everyone.

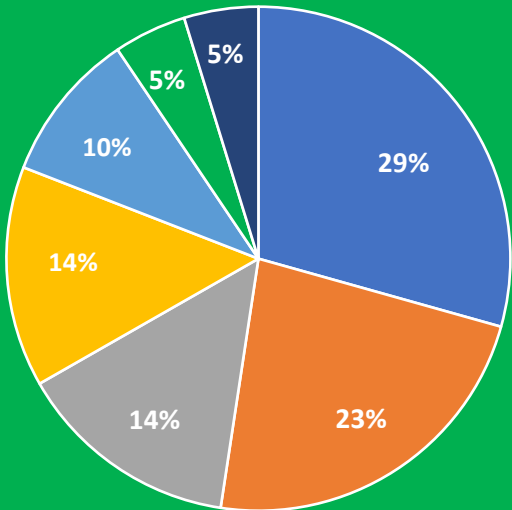
Over the next three to five years, we will invest in artistic excellence, expanded programming, broader engagement, and infrastructure for sustainability and growth.

6-YEAR INCOME COMPARISON



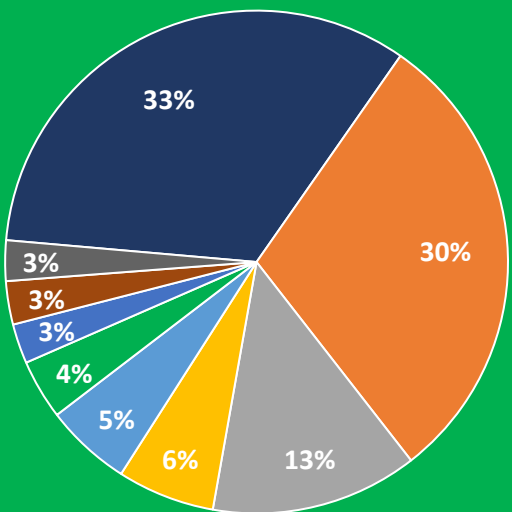
